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Members.

Please be advised that a non-member Caucasian male has been sited roaming the Arrowwood Hills Cooperative community openly carrying a weapon. This person has been seen by several members in the community and this matter has been reported to the local authorities. Below is our current policy for lethal weapons.

Arrowwood Hills Lethal Weapons Policy

Any use, or threatened use, of a lethal weapon by any member or his or her guest or visitor within Co-op grounds or any adjacent property will result in termination of membership and immediate eviction. (Note: it is also illegal to carry a loaded firearm anywhere within the City without permit.)

- For the purposes of this rule, "lethal weapon" is defined as any deadly weapon which, by the manner used, is calculated or likely to produce death or serious bodily injury. This includes, but is not limited to: any and all firearms, any and all hunting knives, switchblades, bows and arrows, machetes, or other knives, baseball bats, etc.
- b. For the purpose of this rule, the clause "by any member or his or her guest or visitor" is interpreted to mean that, should any of the above-mentioned prohibited acts be done by a member or by someone visiting or invited by a member, then this rule will be deemed to be violated and termination of membership will follow.
- Should anyone who is registered as a resident of Arrowwood be convicted of committing a crime on co-op grounds involving a lethal weapon (as above), steps will be taken immediately to terminate the occupancy rights of that person's household or host at the Cooperative.

The same applies to any member who knowingly houses an unregistered person who is convicted of a weaponsrelated crime (as consistent with other crime and guests-responsibility policies). Members, should you come in contact with this person please DO NOT approach and try to take matters in your hands this enforcement shall be a responsibility of management and the Board.

MAINTENANCE CORNER: Fire Extinguishers: Check the date on the bottom of your fire extinguisher. If it's older than 12 years old, call the office for a replacement. Also, check your fire extinguishers gauge monthly to verify that your fire extinguisher is still full. If the extinguisher's gauge needle is in the EMPTY area, call the office for a replacement.

Yellow Jackets and Wasps: This time of year, is when the colonies are at their largest population. These stinging pests are more aggressive in fall because they know their days are numbered and Hornets tending to the Queen are no longer required and are foraging for something sweet to eat. Most are eliminated after a hard freeze.

Those living underground may take a little longer to perish. Common sense dictates it is best to leave wasp and yellow jacket nests alone - unless they're in an area with lots of human activity. If you see ground nests beside a walkway, in a playground or near a door, please call the office.

Social Distancing rules apply

The EMU Community Behavioral Health Clinic is currently accepting new referrals for online Telehealth therapy for adults, teenagers, older children, and parents of younger children. We offer therapy for a wide variety of concerns. All therapy is provided by doctoral students in our Clinical Psychology PhD Training Program under the supervision of fully licensed psychologists. Because therapy is provided by trainees, we are able to provide services for the low cost of \$10 per session. We have availability to see new therapy clients during the fall of 2020, with appointments being scheduled in early September. We also have a limited capacity to provide cognitive and neuropsychological assessments, and we hope to expand those offerings in the near future

Board of Directors Monthly Scoop

We'd like to start off with a huge "thank you" to Arrowwood staff and management for their quick response during the pandemic and their sustained efforts to care for Arrowwood residents and property. As Board Members, we see first-hand the thoughtful, organizational, and planning skills they use in performing their duties. in thoughtfulness, organization, planning and skill. As things return a bit more to normal, we are excited to continue working with them to make our community Arrowwood an exceptional, affordable, community-oriented, and safe place to live and raise our families while remaining affordable.

In August, the Board finalized updates to the Parking Policy in order to address outdated information and ongoing issues, and also to make the policy clearer to members. Members will receive a copy of the updated policy. We encourage you to read the entire document and, of course, to adhere to the policy.

We are also working with our managing agent, Marcus Management, to refinance a loan in order to secure funding for much-needed capital improvements. Our top priorities include replacing siding; solving an ongoing issue of freezing pipes in 2-bedroom units; new windows and patio doors; cement work on sidewalks and porches; and replacing front doors. Stay tuned for more information in the coming months!

The Board is also working with the Landscape, Architecture, Conservation, and Energy (LACE) Committee to develop an overall plan/design for updating our grounds. Our priorities include more native plants and perennials with a more uniform design that is easier for our grounds staff to maintain.

Finally, we'd like to invite you to attend our monthly meetings, held at 1pm on the second Monday of the month via zoom. If you've ever thought of getting involved in your cooperative, this is a great place to start!

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

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
